THE ANTI-NUCLEAR WAR FUND

"The very existence of nuclear weapons, particularly their deployment for ready use, constitutes an unacceptable danger to humanity. The main reason for the arms race, and for the continued manufacture of nuclear bombs and other weapons of war beyond any sane need to deter, is not conflicting ideologies or interests between nuclear weapons states. Rather, it is the vested interests of those who benefit from continuing arms production, research, and development. An informed public opinion demanding removal of this menace is needed to counteract these vested interests."



This is how Alan and Joyce Phillips of Hamilton, Ontario introduced **The Anti-Nuclear War**Fund when they established it in November 1990. Having themselves worked for many years to eliminate nuclear weapons, they are eager now to encourage others to continue developing the informed public opinion that is essential for achieving nuclear disarmament. They have a special concern about the continuing, menacing presence of the nuclear arsenals of the major powers. The Fund is intended to support education and advocacy projects that "work for an immediate and continuing reduction of nuclear weapons made, stored, and deployed in the world."

The goal of The Anti-Nuclear War Fund is the reduction and ultimate elimination of nuclear weapons worldwide.

The Fund is oriented toward supporting small projects of less than \$1,000, but will from time to time consider larger requests. All grant decisions are made by the fund's Grants Committee, with administrative arrangements provided by Project Ploughshares. Decisions on requests for \$1,000 or less will be made within a month of receipt of the application. Decisions on larger requests will be made twice a year, following application deadlines of May 31 and October 31.
