New military technologies are transforming how wars are fought—and how peace is threatened. Project Ploughshares engaged directly with policymakers and global experts to advocate for ethical, rules-based approaches to AI and military innovation, ensuring that Canadian civil society remains a key voice in shaping these fast-evolving security debates.

SHAPED POLICY

➤ Testified before a parliamentary defence committee, contributing to discussions on how new military technologies, climate, and diplomacy should inform Canada's security strategy.

ADVOCATED FOR ETHICS & NORMS

➤ Participated in the Global Summit on Responsible Military Al in South Korea as one of few Canadian civil society voices, advocating for ethical frameworks and rulesbased approaches.

INFLUENCED GOVERNANCE

Participated in highlevel meetings of the Global Commission on Responsible Military Al in Washington, providing expert guidance on international law and policy.

CONNECTED ISSUES ACROSS DOMAINS

➤ Elevated the risks of space militarization within the Al context by linking governance principles across tech and defence discussions in national forums.

EMERGING TECH/AI





Outer space is increasingly a contested domain—but also a place of fragile cooperation. We worked with Canadian and international partners to prevent the weaponization of space, strengthen global governance, and advance transparency, helping Canada contribute constructively to emerging norms around space security and peaceful use.

SHAPED POLICY

➤ Engaged directly with MPs leading Canada's space defence study, informing national conversations on peaceful uses of space and arms control.

INFLUENCED DEBATE

➤ One of only two NGOs to participate in UN discussions on preventing a space arms race, helping shape the outcome report through civil society engagement.

AMPLIFIED COLLECTIVE ADVOCACY

 Organized a coalition of NGOs in support of a joint statement on space security; contributed policy recommendations adopted by multiple countries in their UN positions.

Amid rising global tensions and renewed nuclear threats, Project Ploughshares advanced Canadian leadership in nuclear disarmament. Through high-level diplomacy, public advocacy, and expert convening, we ensured that civil society voices and Canadian values were reflected in key international efforts to reduce nuclear risks and promote lasting peace.

SHAPED POLICY

- Collaborated with Global Affairs
 Canada to promote a values-based foreign policy and encourage
 Canada's active role in global disarmament efforts.
- Presented a formal statement at the NPT Review Conference, inserting Canada's civil society perspective into a major UN disarmament dialogue.

INFLUENCED DEBATE

➤ Co-organized the expert roundtable "Nuclear Disarmament in Times of Unprecedented Risk", which shaped ongoing advocacy and policy recommendations for Canada's nuclear diplomacy.

CONVENED KEY STAKEHOLDERS

➤ Brought together Canadian policymakers, diplomats, and experts to generate actionable dialogue around nuclear risks and solutions.



NUCLEAR WEAPONS



As global arms transfers continue to fuel conflict and civilian harm, we held Canada accountable to its disarmament commitments. Our research, advocacy, and testimony helped shape national and international conversations about export controls, legal loopholes, and the urgent need for responsible arms policy rooted in human rights.

SHAPED POLICY

- ➤ Testified before the Foreign Affairs Committee, contributing directly to a Parliamentary report on Canada's sanctions and arms export regulations.
- ➤ Delivered three official statements at UN Arms Trade Treaty meetings, advocating for accountability in arms transfers.
- Following 2023 testimony before Parliament's Foreign Affairs Committee, was cited in the Committee's 2024 report on sanctions and arms export controls.

INFLUENCED DEBATE

- ➤ Led a high-profile joint campaign calling for an end to arms sales to Israel—resulting in a statement to Canada's PM and Foreign Minister endorsed by over 60 leading human rights organizations.
- Conducted 20+ CBC Radio interviews across Canada, scrutinizing investments in arms manufacturers implicated in weapons transfers to Israel.

AMPLIFIED CIVIL SOCIETY VOICES

 Work cited in a UN Human Rights Office report to the UN General Assembly, highlighting critical gaps in Canada's arms export regime.





Climate change is reshaping global and regional security. We convened diverse leaders—from Indigenous knowledge holders to defence officials—to explore inclusive, systems-based responses to climate-driven risks in the Arctic and beyond. Our work is helping redefine what peace and security mean in a warming, rapidly changing world

CONVENED DIALOGUE

➤ Hosted an innovative multistakeholder workshop on climate, peace, and security in the Arctic bringing together Indigenous leaders, defence experts, diplomats, climate scientists, and civil society.

FOSTERED NEW COLLABORATION

The workshop bridged disciplines and sparked policy innovation, resulting in inclusive, systemsbased solutions to climate-driven insecurity in northern regions.

PIONEERED THOUGHT LEADERSHIP

➤ Positioned Project Ploughshares as a Canadian leader in the emerging field of climate-security, with strong ties to peacebuilding and defence transformation.



SOURCE OF FUNDS




